- ED-6 Promote area housing preservation/restoration.

- B-1 Set up 4 quadrants to work on beautification.

- B-4 Create and post neighborhood banners.
- B-5 Plant new trees.
- B-6 Initiate a litter-free community campaign.
- B-7 Tool sharing program.
- B-8 Target attention on key property owners with code violations.
- B- 9 Promote area parks and related services.
- B-10 Pilot a model area bulky-item pickup system/tire pick up.
- B-11 Recognize property owners who appropriately care for their properties.
- B-12 Enforce no dumping laws; post signs and emphasize "No More Tires!"
- B-13 Get rid of disabled, unlicensed cars.
- B-14 Enforce conformance of businesses/other activities to existing zoning.
