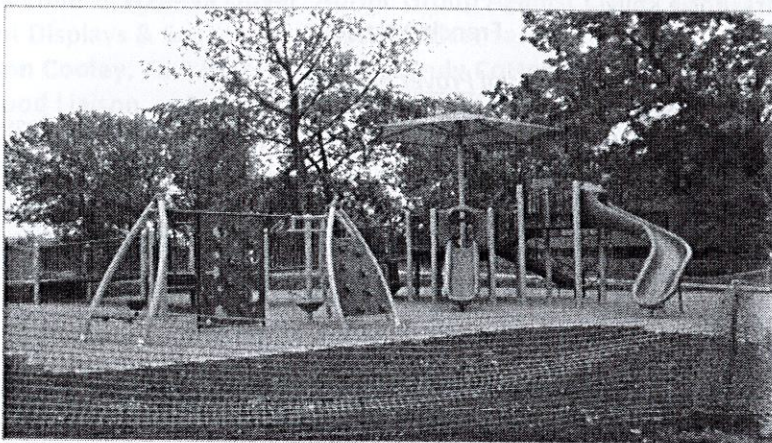

FROM UMB BANK: Avoid ATM Theft

A new and growing trend among identity theft perpetrators is a device called an ATM skimmer that is used to compromise bank information. An ATM skimmer is a theft device that is slipped over the ATM's regular card slot. When a customer slides in a bank card, the device records the customer's banking formation while allowing the transaction to be conducted. Some skimmers are even sophisticated enough to cover the key pads and read PIN numbers.

Thieves are then able to re-encode the stolen debit or credit card information onto magnetic strips of blank gift cards, turning them into counterfeit cards. However, you may be able to spot these skimmers and avoid this type of theft. If you notice a skimmer on a UMB ATM, you can report it. If you are sure there is a skimmer on an ATM, please call the local police to report it. If you think there may be a skimmer, but are unsure, you can report it directly to UMB. We're not asking you to go out of your way to find them—we just ask that you are cognizant when making a transaction at one of our ATMs and get familiar with what "yours" look like normally, so you can recognize later on if something looks unusual.

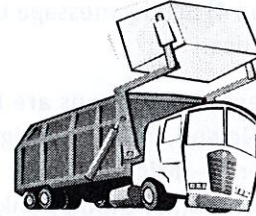

Chicken Chili

2 Pounds Fresh Chicken Breast, sliced

2 inches thick

1 Tablespoon Olive Oil

1.2 Cup Green Bell Peppers, diced

1/2 Cup Onions, diced

3 Cups Water

1 White Chicken Chili Kit

1—15 Ounce Cans White Beans

1 Tablespoon Cheddar Cheese, shredded

1 Tablespoon Sour Crème

Dice chicken in half-inch pieces or cubes. Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add chicken, onions, and bell peppers; sauté until tender. Add water, chili kit, and white beans, stirring well. Bring to a boil. Then reduce heat to low. 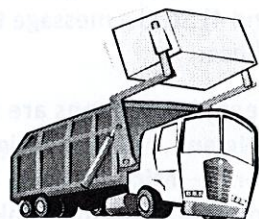

Ivanhoe Positive Alternatives Program

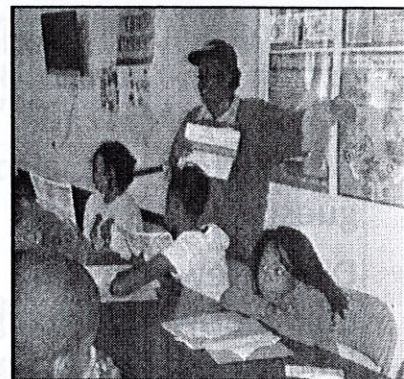


A healthy lifestyle is vital to children during their formative years. In order to combat the negative effects of substance abuse, poor eating habits, and inactivity for children who succumb to it, Ivanhoe has sponsored a **Healthy Lifestyles** program since 2009.

The 2012 spring program focused on nutrition and gardening with Doctor

Barbara Johnson and Toni Gatlin using the *Eating from the Garden* curriculum to provide research-based lessons twice weekly for the children. Lessons include topics on seeds and other plant parts we eat; food safety; nutrients we need; portion control; setting healthy goals; and the importance of physical activity.

The *Eating from the Garden* lessons are followed by a PhotoVoice project taught by KU Graduate Student, Lindsay Loevenstein, and KCHK Vista worker, Andy Volding. This project allows the children to document the need for environmental change through the art of photography. Children have to research questions such as “where does food come from, where do I eat, what is healthy food, and what food means to me?” and give their answer in the form of a photo. The data will be collected at the end of the program and the selected participants will have the opportunity to present their evidence of needed change to the City Council.
