National Night Out is designed to: 1) Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness; 2) Generate support for and encourage neighborhood residents to participate in local crime awareness/prevention initiatives; 3) Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships; and 4) Send a message to criminals that Kansas City neighborhood residents and organizations are determined to end crime and violence in our City's neighborhood.
