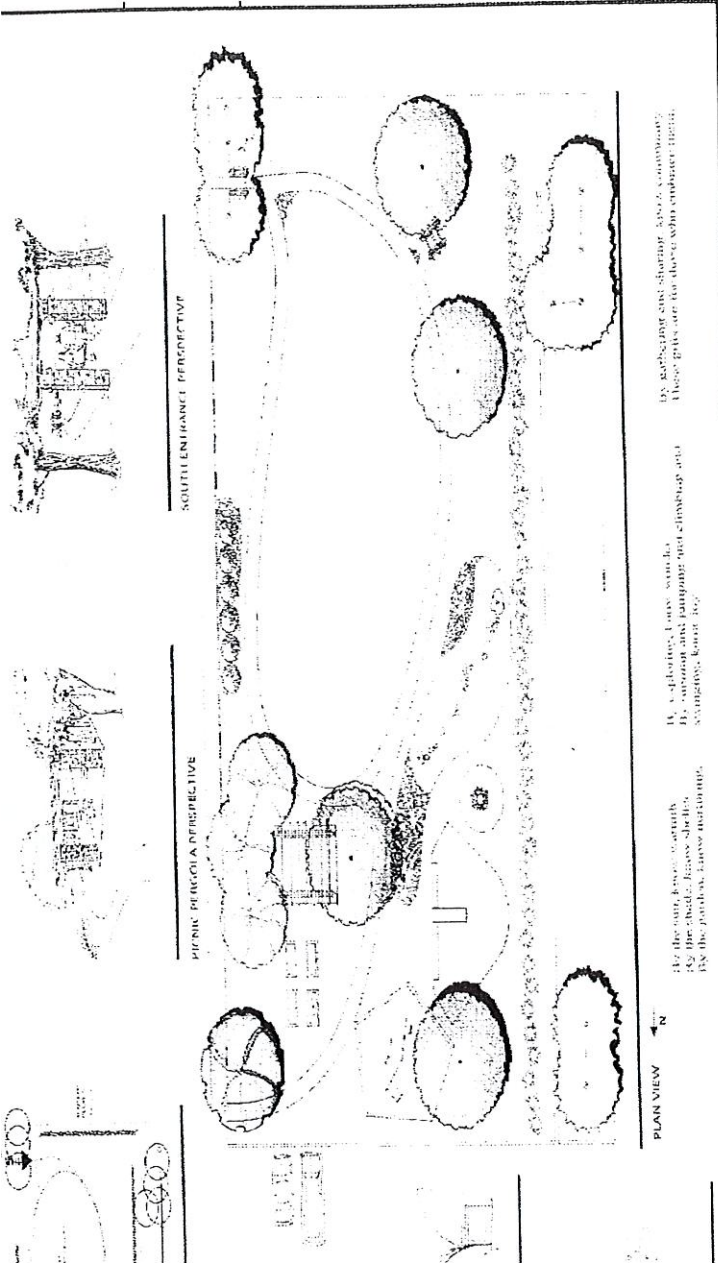
In 2006, shortly after renovation of Nutter Ivanhoe Neighborhood Center was completed, the Ivanhoe Board of Directors searched for a way to show appreciation to Mr. James B. Nutter, Sr. for his support which made renovation of the Center possible. The board decided that naming the vacant lots south of the Center "Jim Nutter Park" would be one small way to show appreciation; however, at that time, Ivanhoe did not have the funding needed to build the park. In 2009, friends of Ivanhoe, Brent Lambi and Marion Wheeler, offered to assist with building the park and, to this end, sought the participation of Hilary Noonan to design the park. Hilary's inspiring design was enthusiastically approved by both the Ivanhoe board and residents. Sean Malone and the Ivanhoe Beautification and Youth, Family Outreach & Education Committees embraced the project and they are providing invaluable assistance to the build. And, special thanks are due Beverly McAuley and Project Change for their key role in planning, providing resources, and implementation. As a result of all of these wonderful people working harmoniously together, on May 15, 2010, Ivanhoe residents and partners will transform what is now simply vacant land into a landmark and symbol of hope for the neighborhood and the City; in tribute to a very special man, who has contributed so much to the Ivanhoe neighborhood and to many, many other institutions and people in our City and beyond.

CHANGES TO CITY'S BULKY TRASH :

The City of Kansas City, Mo., Public Works Departments Solid Waste Division is notifying residents that on Monday May 3, in addition to the City's current no-charge appointment based bulky collection service; residents of Kansas City will have new, low-cost options for more flexible bulky collection and the disposal of materials from home do-it-yourself projects.

Working with Town and Country Disposal, the City's Solid Waste Division has negotiated reasonable rates for residents to use Bulky Express. For a fee, this program can provide bulky collection on a residents next scheduled trash day or on a day other than their regular trash day.

In addition to Bulky Express, the Solid Waste Division has negotiated favorable rates for residents to rent dumpster-like boxes to assist with large amounts of material left over from home do-it-yourself projects. A variety of sizes are available.

To use Bulky Express or schedule the rental of a large dumpster-like box, residents must call Town & Country Disposal at 816-380-5595. This program is managed by Town and Country Disposal.

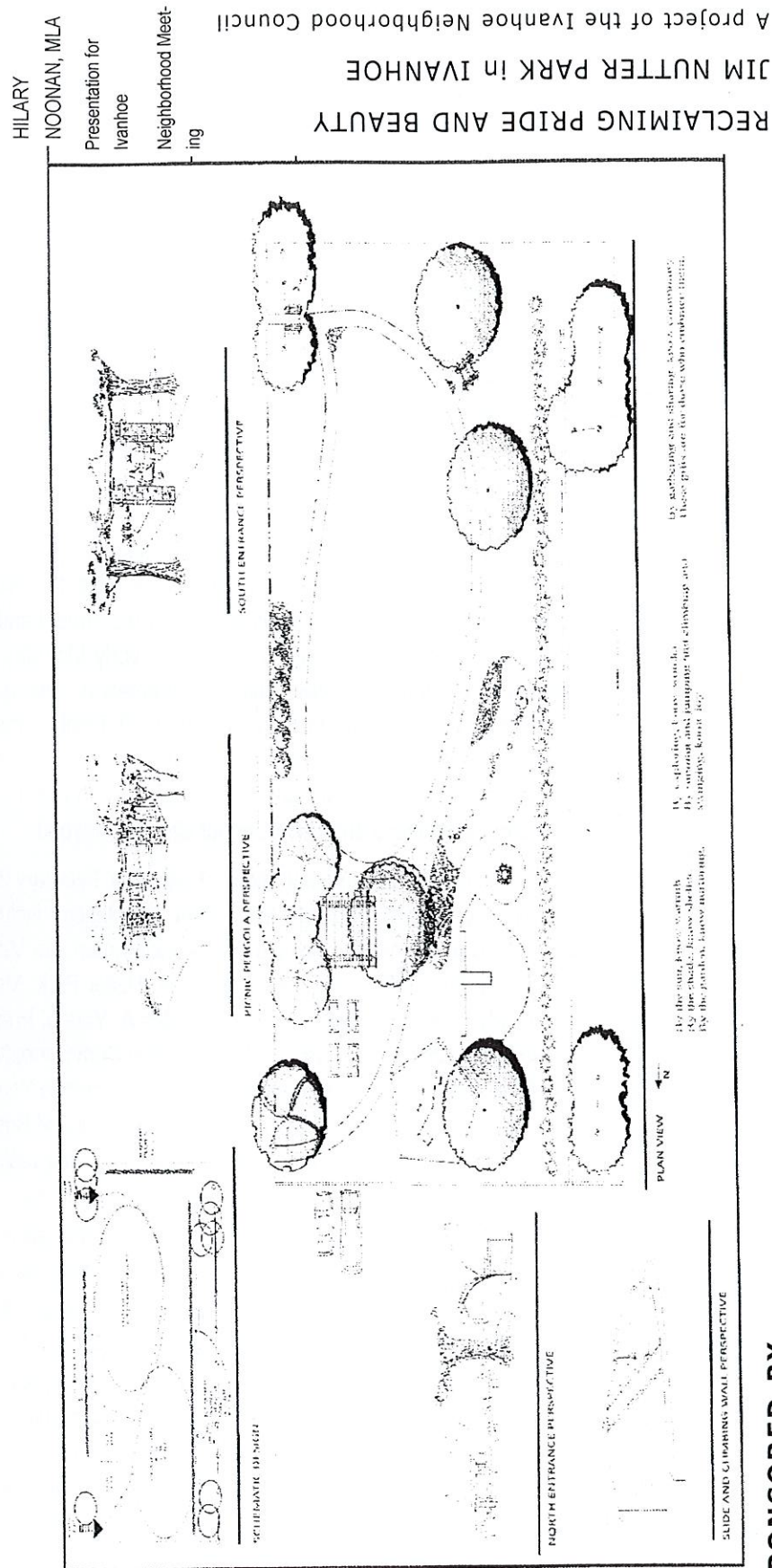
